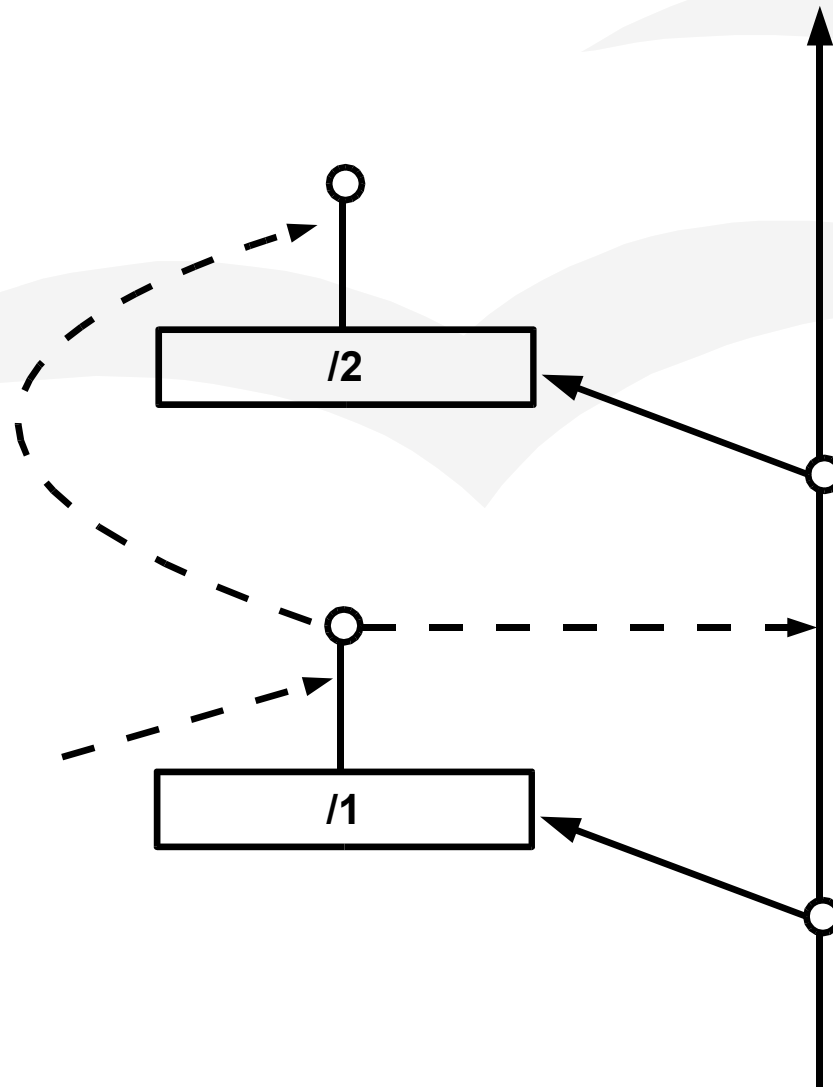
Issues with old dev. process

- OOo branches are open => changes had to be transferred from one branch to the next one
- OOo branches did not merge back with StarOffice[tm] branches
- it took very long to get contributions into the development tree
- many regression bugs => stability issues

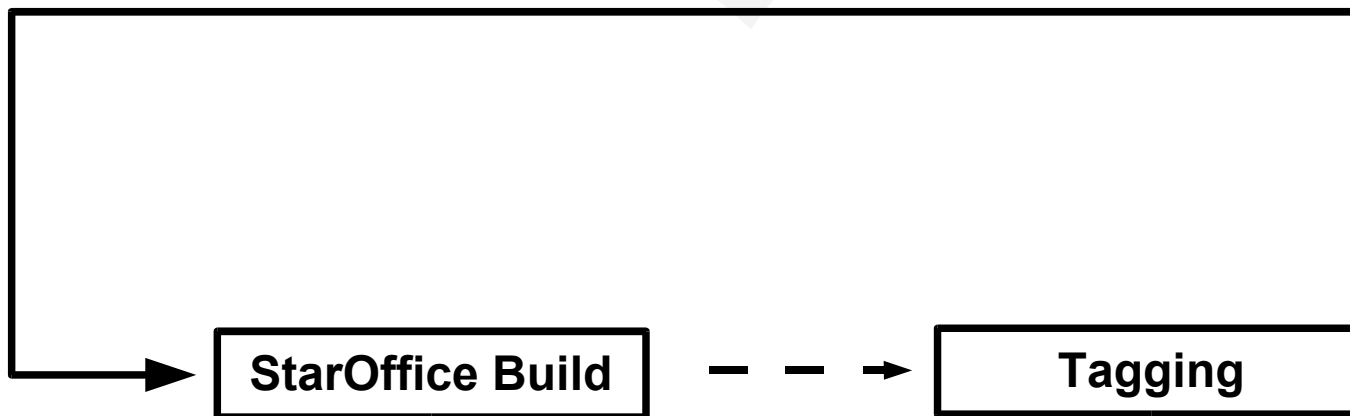

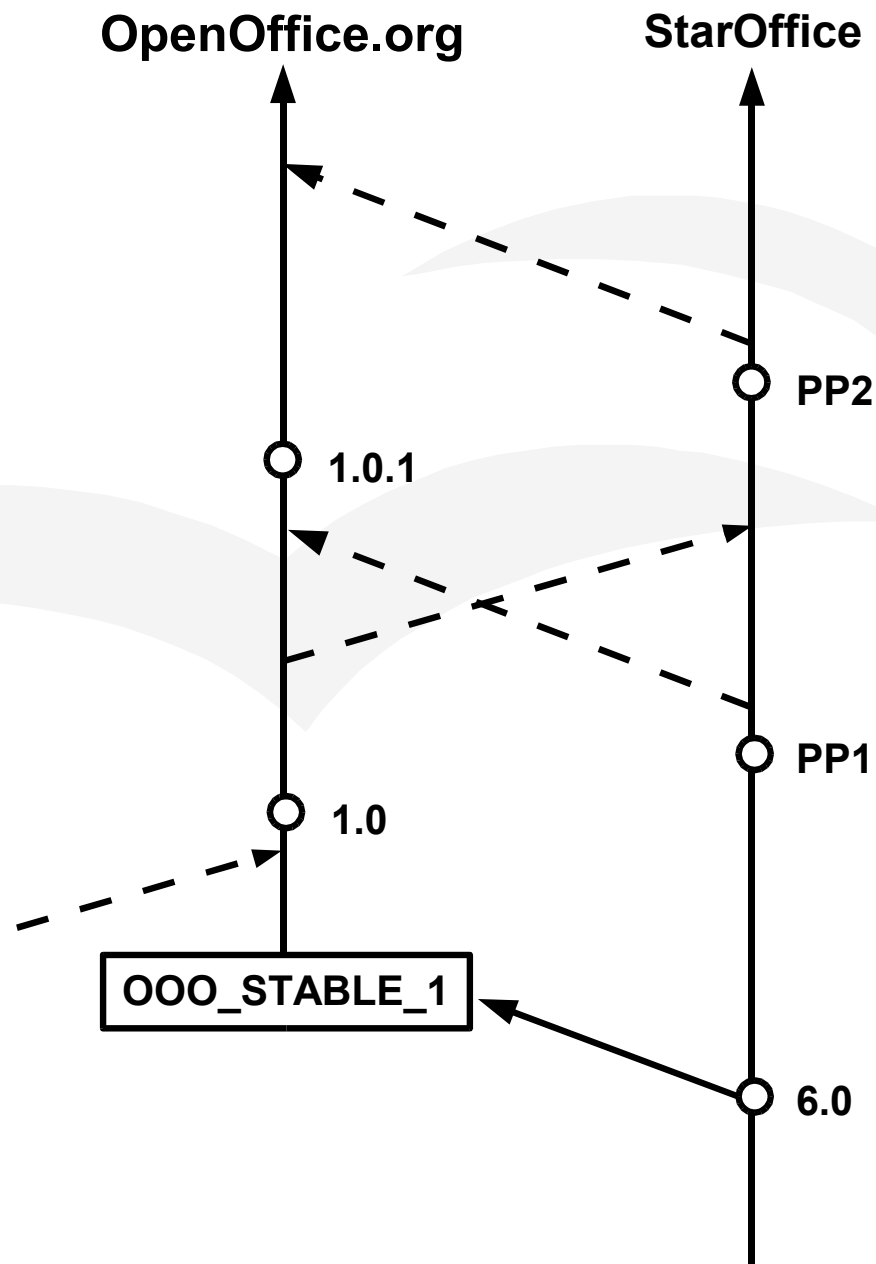

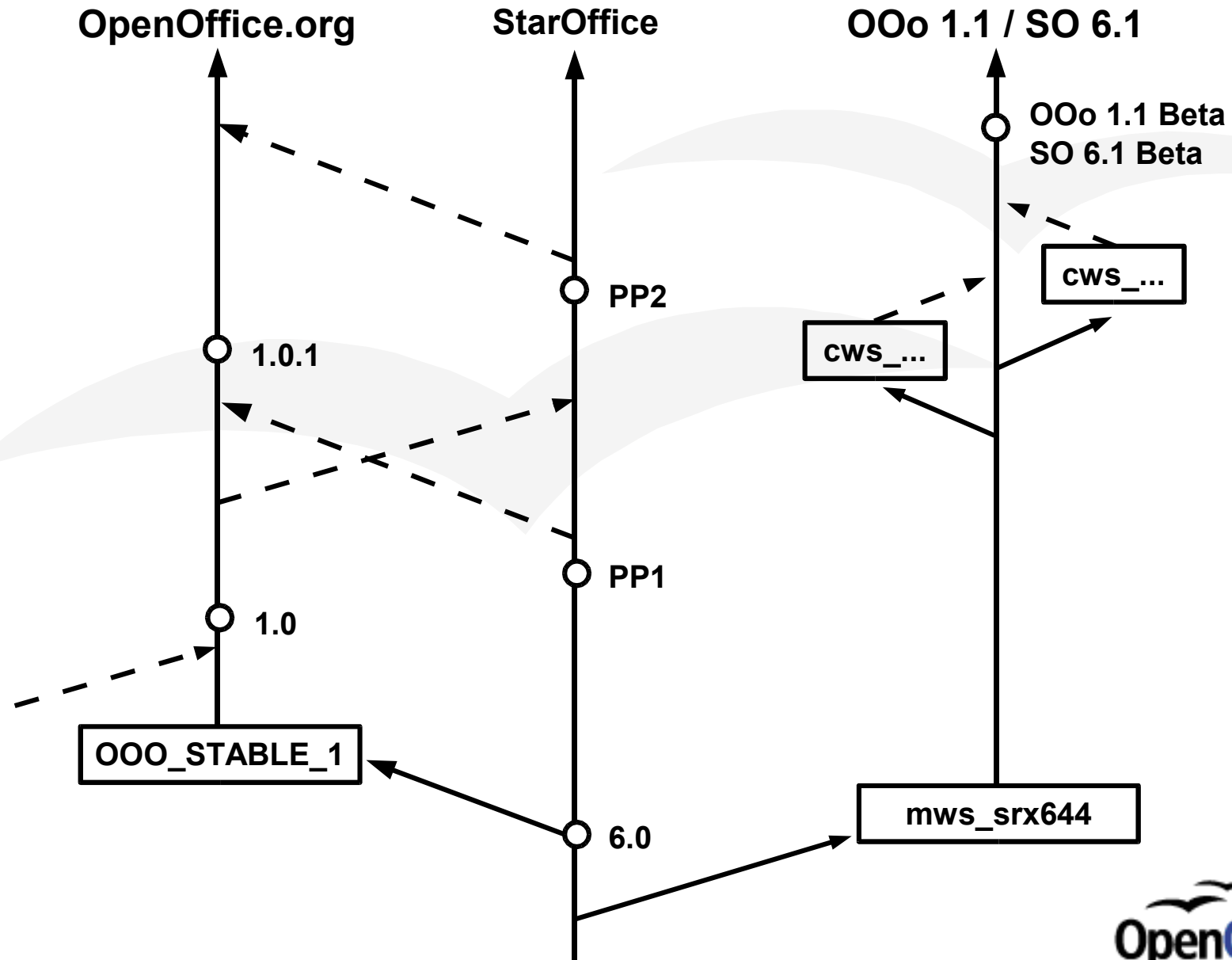

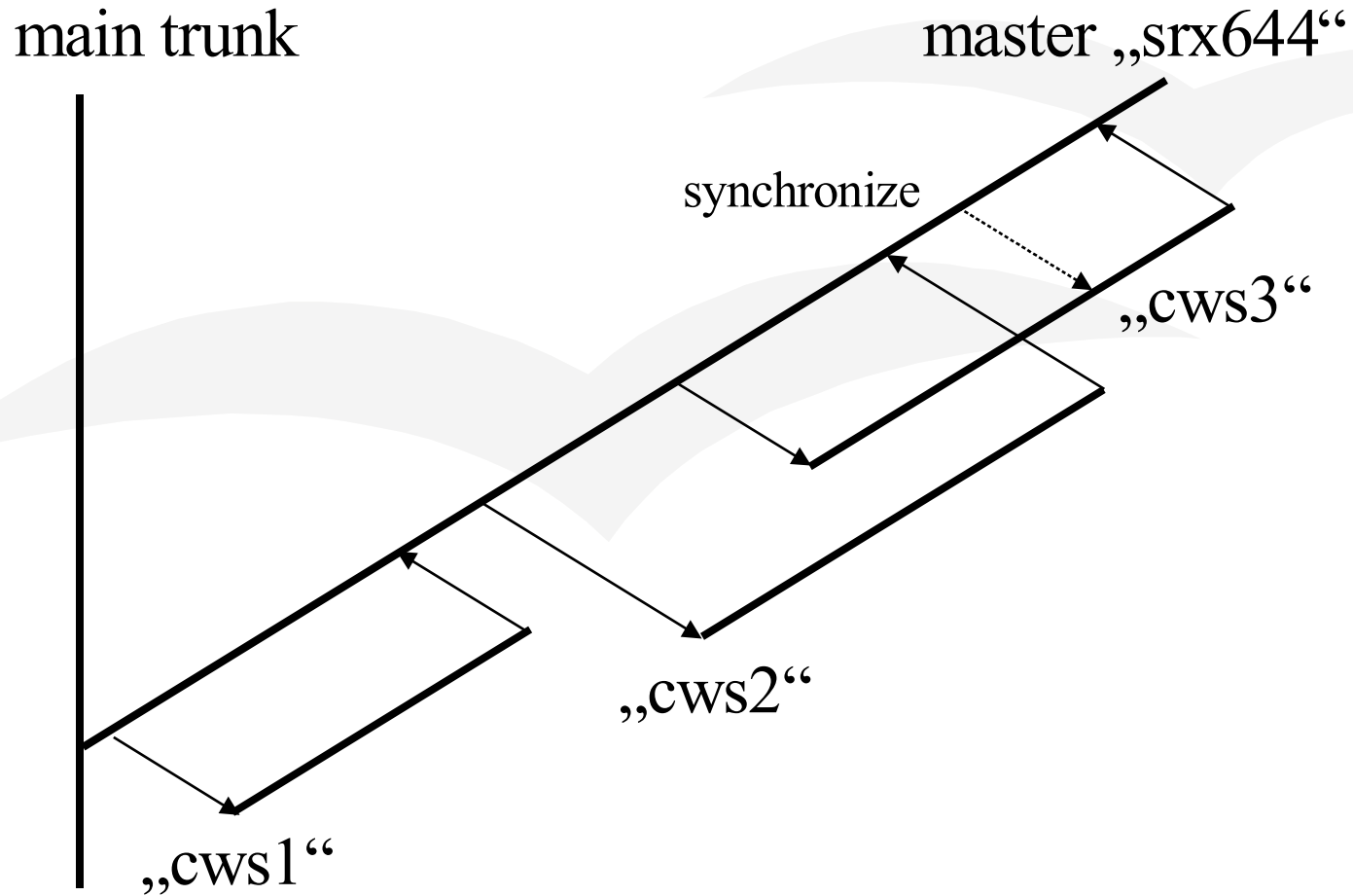
Old Dev. Process – Overview




Benefits of the new process

- StarOffice and OpenOffice.org use the same Master Workspace
- with every StarOffice build it is also possible to create an OpenOffice.org build at the same time
- StarOffice and OpenOffice.org share binaries (binary compatibility)
- it is not necessary anymore to transfer/copy changes from one branch to the next branch
- only fully tested source code gets into production code => fewer regression bugs will occur
- all milestones on the master workspace (the product code) are potentially in a condition to be published

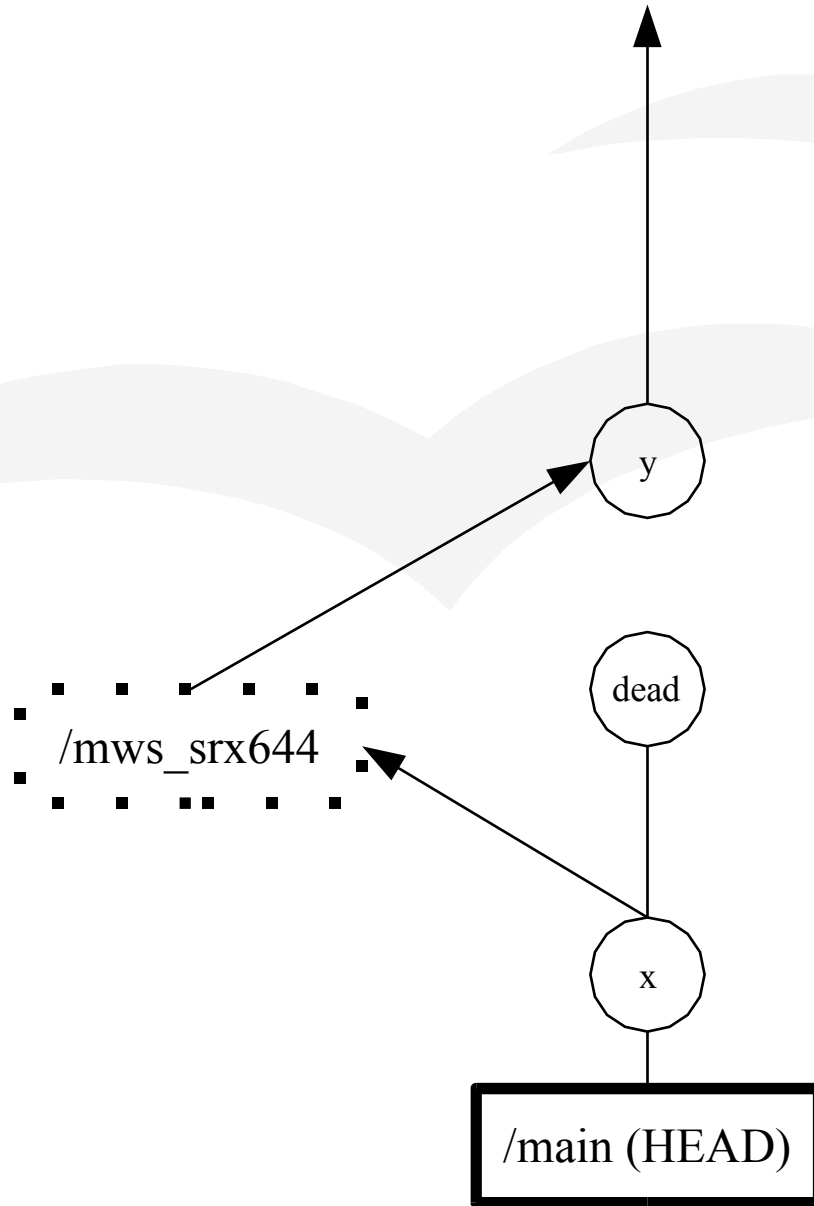


Benefits of the new process

- bugs are more often discovered around the time they are introduced before integrating it into the product
 - the developer has greater freedom to work within a CWS
 - contributions from the community get into the development tree fast
