▶ Rough cost of a migration towards MSOffice XP too expansive



Driving the change

- 2003: The National Executives' academy trains 600 newly hired students to OpenOffice.org
- August-December 2003 : Test phase, 200 IT professionals from the 40 regional boards test OpenOffice.org
 - Coordination meetings on a national scale
 - Coaching and managing a very active forum about OOo
- March 2004 : Satisfactory status report and broadcasting of the migration plan (signed by the general director)
 - Phase 1 : OOo install on the 16000 workstations besides MSOffice 97 > the MS formats are used by default
 - Phase 2 :Starting from January 2005, mandatory use of Ooo and its file format.


- Informative meeting in every regional board
