Issues

- Implement FLOSS in all federal public administration
- Promote FLOSS products inside the public administration;
- Solve interoperability issues between the several layers of the society.



Scenario 1

FLOSS deployment

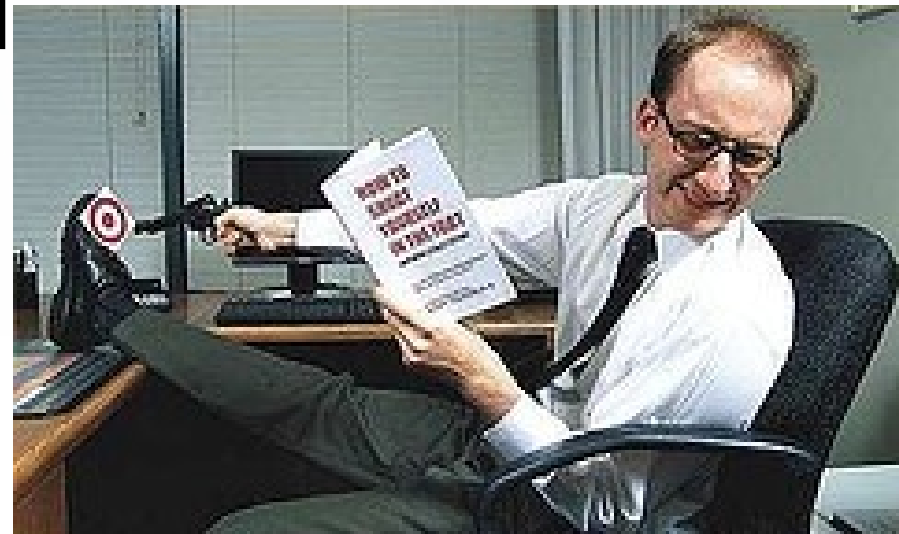


- Migration initiative started in 2004 by ITI – Instituto Nacional de Tecnologia da Informação.
 - Migration proposal of servers and clients to GNU/Linux
 - Lack of skilled personnel in FLOSS solutions
 - High rejection especially by lack of planning and end-user education & training
 - File format issues.

Scenario 1

Consequences

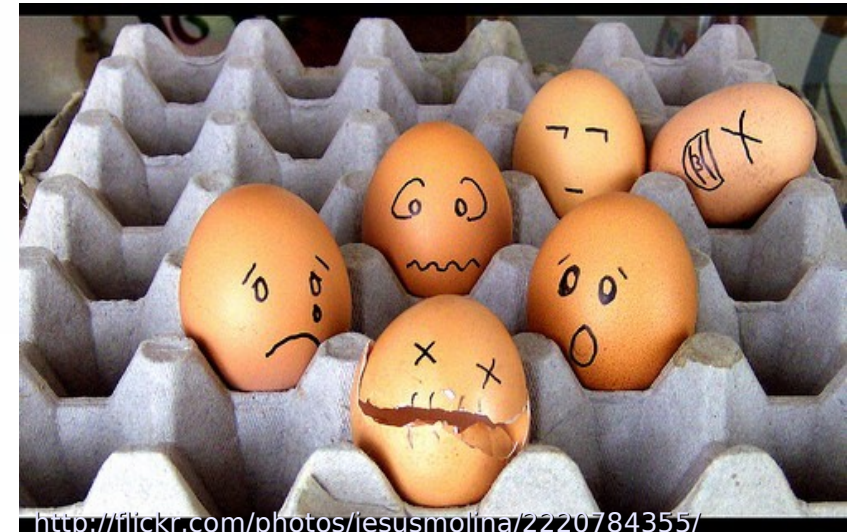
- Project too ambitious (all client applications) which resulted in excess of issues beyond support capacity
- No planning for Education and Training, which resulted in a negative perception by end-user, forcing a rollback.
- End-user resistance and rebellion.



Scenario 2

FLOSS promotion

- New products resistance (same technologies and usage), especially because of the previous failures.
- Public administration proverbial inertia



Scenario 3

File interchange

- Federal Government is composed of common 3 parts (as usual in modern democracies)
 - Executive, Legislative e Judiciary
- Initial actions in Federal Executive
 - Issues in file interchange between:
 - Ministeries;
 - Federal Official Banks
 - Other admins;
 - Legislative & Judiciary.



Reaction

Gov. New policies

- Knowledge of BrOffice.org mandatory for public admission career;
- Caixa Federal issues a public bid for BrOffice support services requiring hiring of BrOffice.org local developers;
- Creation of the **CISL-FLOSS Deployment Committee**, where the 1st step is:
MIGRATE to BrOffice.org!



Reaction Open Standards

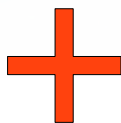
- e-PING gains strength and Standards are required in services
- Brazil votes NO for OpenXML in ISO
- ABNT approves ODF as Brazil. Standard

- Local user groups (2004)
- Investments in main OSS events (FISL e Conisli);
- Relationship with communities and seek of a sustainable marketplace;

Achievements

Federal Gov

- Infraero adopt BrOo – USD 2M / year;
- Linux Educacional;
 - 2008: 29.000 labs = ~36.000.000 estudantes;
 - 2009: 53.000 labs = ~52.000.000 estudantes.
- All levels of the Labor Judiciary
- House of Representatives saves USD 2,5M
- Dataprev – 38.000 estações – USD 12M
- Banco do Brasil – 90.000 desktops – USD 30M.



Achievements

State Gov.



- State Govs.
 - Ministério Público de TO = USD 225K;
 - Education in PR = 2.000 schools = 40.000 workstations w/ BrOffice.org;
 - Tribunal de Contas de MT e MS;
- Standards
 - State of Paraná aproves ODF Bill and other states considers the same.
 - House of Representatives for a National ODF bill

Achievements Community

- Gov. seeks to involve its workers in FLOSS projects
- Brasilia Protocol signed (ODF in Public Administration)
- Increase in demand for services and concern to address hiring of community players:
Sustainable marketplace!
- **Investments** in community Projects – 3rd BrOffice.org Annual
