1.1 Creating a content handler with mod_perl 1.0

Handlers are simply perl subroutines called by the server at various stages of the HTTP request cycle. A content handler is a subroutine that is called by the response phase. Handlers, are typically created as a perl modules, separate files store in a library, and accessible via perl's @INC array.

For example, here's an example that returns a greeting and the current local time.

Save the above as a file file in your perl library (e.g. *My/Greeting.pm*). Now, to return the above greeting when the URL /hello is visited on your server:

```
<Location /hello>
SetHandler perl-script
PerlHandler My::Greeting
```
