Chapter

### Tapestry and J2EE

he Primix Virtual Library is a full-fledged demostration of Tapestry and of Tapestry interacting with Enterprise JavaBeans. It is based on an actual application developed internally at Primix; the idea being to provide an application that allows everyone at the company to share their books. A database stores information about the users of the application and the books they own and are borrowing from other users.

Users should be able to connect to the application and begin using it immediately to search for books. If they want to borrow books they must first log in (possibly, registering themselves on the fly).

The goal was to have a useful, streamlined system that could be used internally at Primix *and* to serve as a demonstration of the full power of Tapestry.

The application consists of two modules: VlibBeans which contains the entity and session beans for the application, and Vlib, which contains the Tapestry user interface for the application.

The Virtual Library requires an application server to host the EJBs. This demonstration works around the open-source jBoss application server, available from <a href="http://www.jboss.org/">http://www.jboss.org/</a>.

The Tapestry portion of the application requires a servlet container. The Tapestry distribution ships with a copy of the Jetty HTTP Servlet server, which is also open source. More information on Jetty is available at <a href="http://www.mortbay.com/">http://www.mortbay.com/</a>. The Virtual Library is pre-configured to work with Jetty.

Finally, all development has been under Windows NT and Windows 2000. We have not yet had a chance to setup under Linux or Solaris.

# Chapter

### Setting up the Application

he Tapestry distribution includes pre-compiled copies of the Virtual Library components, as well as the source code and the tools to recompile the source.

#### Install jBoss

jBoss is not distributed with Tapestry (it's a 4 MB download), but is available from http://www.ejboss.org. At the time of this writing, the current version of jBoss was 2.0\_FINAL.

jBoss is exceptionally easy to setup, simply unpack the distribution (jBoss-2.0\_FINAL.zip) to a directory, do some minor configuration (see next section) and its ready to go.

#### Configure ¡Boss

Configuring jBoss is easy, as long as you've set up the JBE first. **Important:** You should have JDK 1.3 installed, and have the JBE configured to use it. The Virtual Library EJBs are configured such that the server and client must both be running JDK 1.3.

You must edit your config/LocalConfig.mk, adding a definition for JBOSS\_DIR, which will identify the directory you installed jBoss into (typically, C:/jBOSS-2.0\_FINAL).

Change to the VlibBeans directory (which should be C:\Tapestry-x.x.x\Examples\VlibBeans).

Execute the command make configure-jboss:

This executes a series of commands that sets up an example copy of the Primix Virtual Library database and changes the jBoss configuration to recognize it (it edits the jboss.conf and jboss.jcml files). It also sets up JNDI properties and copies Tapestry.jar and gnu-regexp.jar into the jBoss lib/ext directory.

The Primix Virtual Library database is an InstantDB database. Running make configurejboss again will overwrite the database with a fresh copy.

#### Start jBoss

Next, start up jBoss with the command make run. This will build the VlibBeans.jar file, deploy it, and start up jBoss.

The EJB portion of the application, including the database, is now ready to go. The database has about twenty books owned by three different users:

#### Start Jetty

The presentation layer of the application is the Vlib module, in C:\Tapestry-x.x.\Examples\Vlib.

Go to that directory and execute make run. The JBE will build the Vlib.war file, and start Jetty up to service it.



# A Tour of the Virtual Library Application

ou can start the Vlib application with the URL:


http://localhost:8080/vlib

The initial page for the application allows you to select either the JSP or Tapestry implementations:



There are two versions of the application. The full version is implemented using Tapestry. The JSP version of the application is a limited implementation using standard servlet and JSP technologies; it exists for comparison of performance and difficulty of implementation.

Select the first option, "Start Tapestry Application". You'll then see the home page for the application, from which you may search for books.



Page Home


The current version of the Primix Virtual Library is simple, presentation wise. We will shortly be sprucing it up with graphics and colors.

Across the top are several navigation options. The Home link returns the user to this search page. The My Books links is activated once a user logs in; it shows the list of books owned by the user. The Login link allows a user to log into the system, or register on the fly. The logout allows the user to exit the system.

Let's start by finding all the O'Reilly books in the database.


Select "O'Reilly" in the Publisher pulldown, then click the Search button.

You'll get a list of all the books, sorted by title.




Page Matches

You can click on the title of a book to get more information about that book:




Page ViewBook

Or, you can click on the name of a person to see the books they own:

You might notice the text "[Borrow]" that appears on several pages ... this is the borrow button, and is only enabled once you login. Use the "[Login]" button to log into the application.




Page Login

The application uses a cookie to remember your email address (which is used as a unique identity when logging in). Enter the email address "hship@primix.com" and the password "secret".

This brings you to the "My Books" page, where you can manage the books you own. It has two sections; the upper section shows the book you own, allowing you to edit or delete them.

The second section shows the books you currently have borrowed, with an option to return each book.





The remainder of the application, adding and editting books, is basically self-explanatory.


### The Virtual Library in Detail

he Virtual Library consists of twelve pages, as shown in the web diagram:



We've already seen several of these pages (Home, Login, MyBooks, Matches, ViewBook and Person).


User's are allowed to register on the fly with the Vlib, by clicking the "register now" link on the Login page.



Page Register


The names and e-mail are validated to not be duplicates. A future enhancement to the system will be a more involved system, where the user is sent e-mail with a registration code to unlock access to the Virtual Library.

Once logged in, a user my add a new book (using the button on the Home page, or on the MyBooks page):




Page NewBook

A logged-in user may also edit their books. This may be to fill in additional data such as the ISBN, to add notes to the description, or to change the holder of the book (after taking the book back from a borrower).




Page EditBook

As user may also edit their profile (including name, email and password) from the MyBooks page.




Page EditProfile

Users may also delete books they no longer have (or perhaps, no longer wish to share). This is accomplished by clicking the "[Delete]" button for a book (on the MyBooks page).

Finally, a user who is no longer using the system (whether logged in or not), may log out.
